TABLE TALK

1. This weeks work is to exegete the culture and your life. The Acts 2:42 passage gives us a vivid description of what life looked like when the believers walked in the Spirit. Observe their daily routines and reflect on your own. What are the values that drive your life and community. What is community like for you? Who knows you? Do you have regular people you seek out in your life?
2. Do you look at your community from a getting or a giving perspective? If you are in a family, what value do you put on community for your children? How does that reflect on your choices with your time?
3. Are there films, books or stories that paint pictures of community that particularly impact you? What are the aspects you miss and would like to build into your life? What would be the cost in your life to move towards that? What is the difference between community as the world knows it and 'Community that is 'Christian' or Biblical? How is that different or the same as being part of 'the church.'
4. Do you know how our church has chosen models of developing community? How have you contributed to the communities at Redeemer? How can you?

SERMON TEXT - Galatians 5:16-25

16 But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. 17 For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. 18 But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. 19 Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, 20 idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, 21 envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. 24 And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. 25 If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit. 26 Let us not become conceited, provoking one another, envying one another.
