Frequently Asked Questions

Why is Redeemer taking a different approach to summer equipping? Summer routines free us to try something new in our learning and practice of the Scriptures. We also value our volunteers. This change allows teachers and childcare workers to enjoy a summer sabbatical in hopes that the commitment, enthusiasm and retention of volunteers during the academic year will increase. We also want to focus on training to enhance and strengthen gifts of Equipping Hour teachers during the rest of the year.

Why change the first worship service time?

The later start for the first worship service reduces the intermission between services, thus encouraging people to serve in childcare. The first worship service was moved later to avoid overcrowding in the second service. We also wanted to better serve needs of newcomers through the 9:30 service during the summer.

What are plans for the Fall Equipping Hour?

We will resume the school year schedule of 8:30 Worship, 10AM Equipping Hour and 11:15 Worship beginning September 12th.

Host a Backyard Bible Club

This non-traditional approach to Vacation Bible School focuses on welcoming and caring for children and families (including those with little or no church background) with an event you bring to your neighborhood.
